Luke 3:1-14

## - Advent Reflections

- Advent is as much a season of reflection as it is preparation!
- Malachi warns of God's judgment against sorcery, adultery, perjurers, oppressors of the least of these, those neglect and reject the sojourner, and ultimately those who do not fear God. (Malachi 3:5)
- Then, about 400 years later, John the Baptist proclaims:
   "Even now the axe is laid to the root of the trees. Every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire." (Luke 3:9)

## - The Fruit-Bearing of Reflection

- Compassion, generosity, and acts of mercy and justice are contagious!
- The axe is laid to the roots to strip the fruitless from stealing away what isn't shared!
- Examining our reflection holds us accountable to where we place our hope.

## - Reflections of Righteousness

- Our acts of service are reflections of Christ's righteousness within us!
- Intentional discipleship answers the question of 'What Shall We Do?'
  with faithful and demonstrable action!
