Mark 10:23-31

- We anchor ourselves to broken and impossible things!

- Wealth and riches are not inherently evil...
 - ...but the influence we allow them to have can be!
- When our comfort that we've created for ourselves on earth is more important than being uncomfortable we need to check our priorities!
 - Our definition of wealth should include insecurity.
 - Our practice of wealth can not avoid brokenness in the bodies around us.
- The illusion of independence hides the baggage that ultimately anchors us to the impossibility of enter the Kingdom of God on our own.

- "All things are possible with God."

- We need a new metric for what it means to be rich or have wealth!
- Our created sense of dependency is wrecked in the fall...
 - ...redeemed in Christ's death on the cross...
 - ...and restored in the first fruits of the Resurrection!
- God leads us into His Kingdom by unburdening us from the very thing that binds us to brokenness the most!

- Eternal upset in the balance of power.

- "...many who are first will be last, and the last first."
- Our heart in ministry beats to carry the blood of Christ to every extremity of the Body!
- The grace of God overcomes the impossibility of unburdening us, and makes our hope of His Kingdom a Resurrection reality!



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
